Moscow, in Russia, is the largest city (not including transcontinental cities) with more than 12 million inhabitants.

Mount Elbrus in Russia (5,642 metres/18,510ft) is the highest mountain in Europe and is part of the Caucasus Mountain range.

The Volga River in Russia (3,530km) is Europe's longest river.

The population of Europe is approximately 744 million (2025).

Continent - any of the world's main continuous expanses of land made up of different countries.

Physical features - geographical features that shape the Earth's surfaces.

Human features - geographical features that are man - made.

Regions - a part of the world or country that have definable features but not always fixed boundaries.

Tourism - the activities of people traveling to and staying in places outside their usual environment for leisure, business or other purposes.
