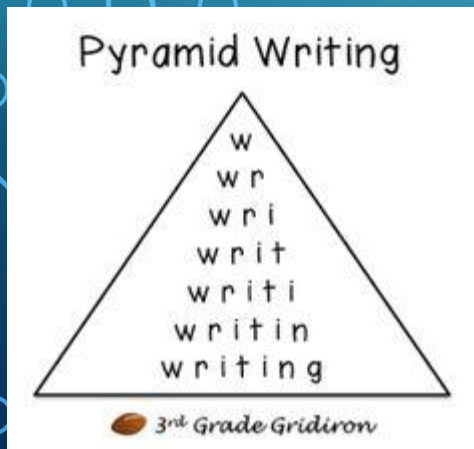
We hope you are all well, and look forward to seeing some of you on zoom later.
