Dwindling, the king's power was not what it once was.

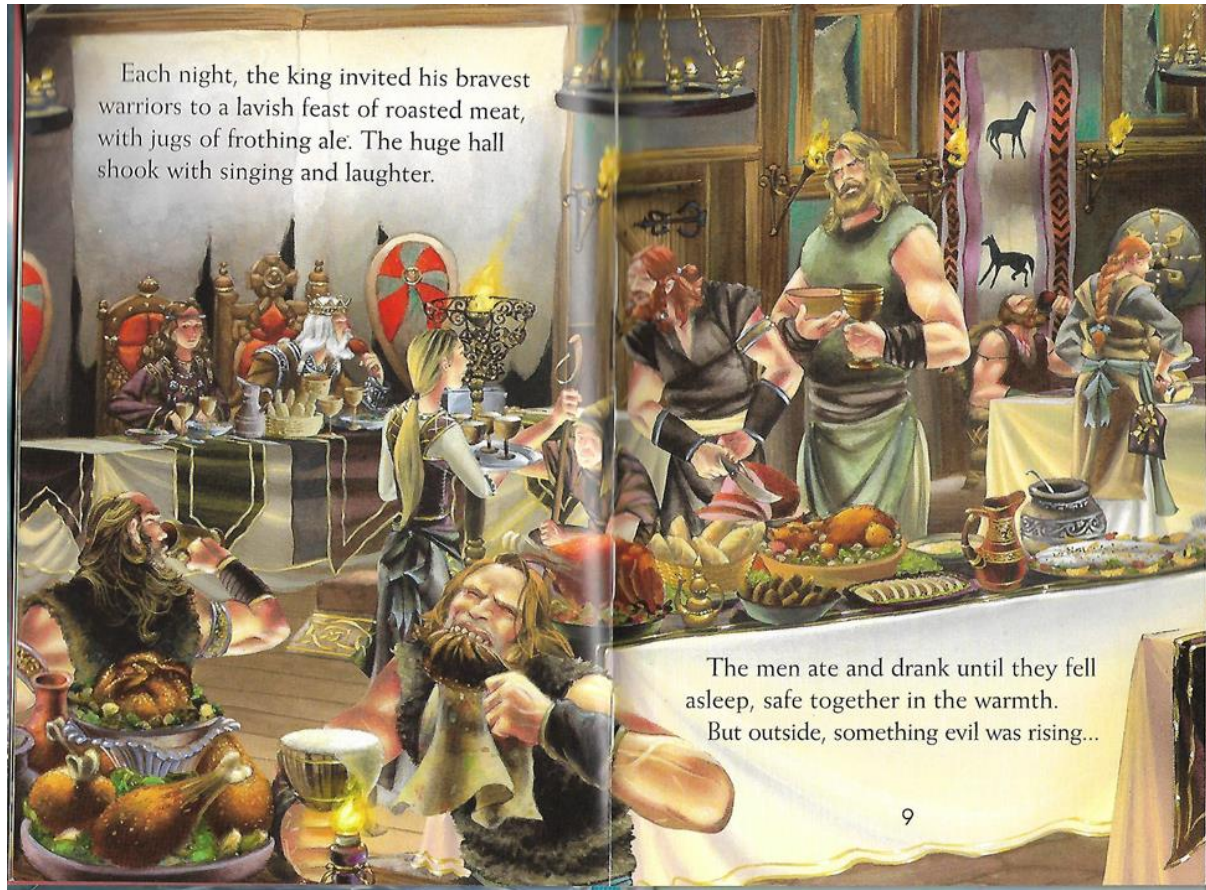
Answer to yesterday's Riddle: What has a face, two hands but no legs? (A Clock)
