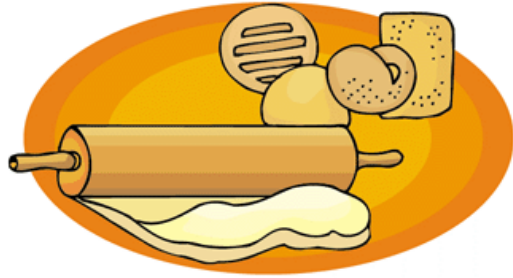


Activity 1 – Try and bake something.

A big cake, decorated elegantly, fell....

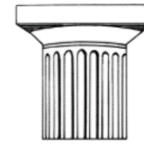


Activity 3 –

Write a postcard to a friend or relative in self isolation.

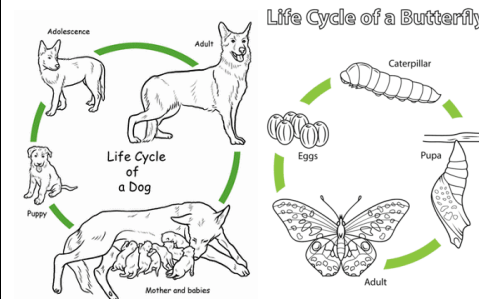
Draw a picture on the front and write a message on the back.

Activity 6-

Design a healthy 3 course meal. What would you have for starter, main and dessert?



Extension: Can you research Greek food and include some traditional Greek dishes in your menu?

Activity 7 -

Read the story of Medusa (included in the Home Learning packs or use the link on the class page).

Write a 3-sentence summary of the story, making sure to include as many key facts and details as possible.

Challenge: Create a character description of what Medusa would look like. Think about the key features described in the story, as well as using her surroundings to create a negative atmosphere. Remember your FANTASTICS!

Extension: Find out what happens in another famous myth including Medusa and the hero, Perseus.

Activity 8 -

Using the myth of Medusa the Gorgon, create a piece of artwork of her. You could use any media you like, such as pencil, chalk or paint (if available).

Activity 4 - No internet access option:

Zeus asked Paris of Troy to give a golden apple to the most beautiful god. Three goddesses claimed the apple: Hera, Athena, and Aphrodite. Each of the goddesses also offered Paris a gift as a bribe in return for the apple; Hera offered to make him the king of Europe and Asia Minor, Athena offered him wisdom and skill in battle, and Aphrodite offered to give to him the love of the world's most beautiful woman, Helen of Sparta, who was already married to King Menelaus of Sparta. Paris chose Aphrodite, a decision that had fatal consequences.

Would you make the same choice as Paris? Justify your opinion. Write a short paragraph.
