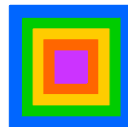

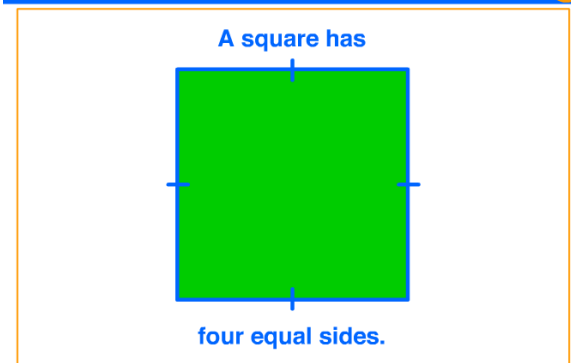
square
