Dear Parents,

Welcome back! We hope you had a wonderful time off during the Easter holidays. Please find below a summary of the main learning areas during the next half term and some general reminders. This term is a very important one for Year 6, with end of primary school assessments and the transition to secondary school coming up. Please be aware that the SATs assessment week commences on Monday 11th May. The dates for class transition days to Longsands and Ernulf for the children are Monday 1st and Tuesday 2nd July, with other secondary schools confirming their dates separately.

Homework

Each Year 6 class will be handing out Maths and English homework (revision books) on a **Friday**, which will need to be returned by the following **Friday**. We expect the children to complete the given pages and ensure it is done with care and a high level of effort. Homework books **must** be handed in every week, and not at the end of each term.

After SATs, we will update the children and Class Dojo on how homework will be set.

P.E.

Year 6 will have P.E. sessions every Monday morning and Tuesday afternoon although children should have their kit with them each day as this is subject to change. Please ensure your child has their full P.E. kit in school at all times and are prepared for the changeable weather. Alongside this, swimming lessons will take place this term – a schedule for this has already been sent out and children should be aware of which group they are in.

There will be regular updates over the term on Class Dojo and on the school webpage, letting parents know about important updates and the learning that has been taking place.

Summer Term 2026 Curriculum Units for Year 6



Geography

'Rivers' will be our geography unit this term, focussing on the different stages of a river and how they have shaped the land, towns and country we live in.



Religion and Worldviews

Our unit question in R&W is 'Why is there suffering?', looking how different religions interpret negative issues in the world.



Science

Our unit for this term will be 'Light and Reflection', followed by a Science-based project.



Art

Our artwork will involve Sculpture and 3D, in which the children will focus on creating expressive pieces of art to represent memories.



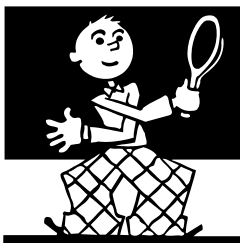
Spanish

We will be focussing on singing and performance within a school production, looking at how to project our voices, as well as composing a leavers' song.



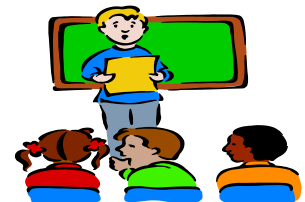
P.E.
