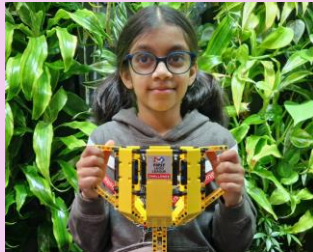
YDP Cambridge Cup
